## Description

Soundboard: two-piece spruce: fine grain Bowl: 15 rosewood staves, inner 13 ribs narrower, divided by maple stringing Clasp: rosewood; festooned lower end Head: Spanish cedar veneered with rosewood on front face Neck: Spanish cedar; integral with head Binding: ebony; trim on top comprised of two-ply light and dark hardwood Fingerboard: brown-stained maple; 20 nickelsilver frets under E and A strings, 18 under D and G strings; mother-of-pearl dots behind 3rd and 10th fret; mother-of-pearl single dots inlaid behind 5th, 7th, 12th, and 14th frets; ivory-celluloid side dots inlaid behind 3rd, 5th, 7th, 12th, and 14th frets Nut: bone Bridge: missing Tuners: enclosed worm-gear machine tuners with nickelplated steel cover, brass rollers, and ivory-celluloid heads Tailpiece: nickel-plated brass; missing cover Rosette: elliptical; ebony; trim comprised of four-ply light and dark hardwood Pick guard: imitation tortoiseshell-celluloid Lacquer: slightly yellowed with craquelure Bowl lining: black-painted cloth Blocks: light hardwood neck and bottom blocks Top braces: spruce brace with tapered ends above soundhole; spruce braces with tapered ends below soundhole and at widest point of body; thick spruce lining along inside of bend Linings: dark-stained spruce
