Description

Brass, nickel-silver finger buttons, double loop, removable shank with telescopic tuning slide (main tuning slide) adjusted by ligature screw, three Périnet valves (1, $\frac{1}{2}$, $1\frac{1}{2}$), bottom-sprung, alignment by one key on pistons, single water key at first bow, windway 3-2-1 Brass tuning shank with telescopic tuning slide Brass lyre Two unstamped German-silver mouthpieces (one original, the other one later) The lyre in an aureole with the monogram JTL was registered in 1866, and in 1888 this mark was changed to DULCIS / FORTIS [lyre in aureole, bird in horn superimposed] / J.T. L. The number "87" in the signature may be a serial number or the date.
