Description

Brass, mother-of-pearl finger buttons, double loop, tuning slide at second bow, removable leadpipe (shanks), three Périnet valves (1, $\frac{1}{2}$, $1\frac{1}{2}$), top-sprung, spring outside stem, alignment by one key on piston (nickel-plated brass), single water key at first bow, windway 3-2-1. Brass tuning shank for A (original) and B-flat (replaced) August Pollmann's first known appearance in the literature is 1880. His close ties to Markneukirchen, Saxony, suggest that this instrument is likely a German import.
