### Description

Neck: maple; laminated center stripe comprised of three-ply strip of dark-brown-stained maple, plain maple, and dark-brown-stained maple Peghead: dark-brown-stained hardwood veneer; integral with neck Fingerboard: dark-brown-stained hardwood; 17 nickel-silver frets; single mother-of-pearl dots behind 5th, 7th, 10th, and 12th frets Heel cap: black plastic Head: skin Dowel stick: maple Rim: hardwood with bird's-eye-maple veneer and three-ply strip of dark-brown-stained maple, plain maple, and dark-brown-stained maple inlaid along edge toward resonator; bottom edge of rim painted black Bracket hooks: 20 nickel-plated steel Tension hoop: nickel-plated brass Resonator: three-ply bird's-eye-maple with two f-holes Armrest: none Nut: dark-brown-stained maple Tuners: nickel-silver tension pegs with ivoroid heads Tailpiece: nickel-plated

steel Finish: clear lacquer
